Take part in a celebration of Samhain (Festival of the Dead) on October 29th!

We've had a message from Christy who is organising a Samhain event at Woodfield Pavilion on Tooting Common and are looking for volunteers:

At 5:30pm on **Sunday, 29 October**, we will be inviting the public to witness a 'gathering' to celebrate Samhain. There will be an 'altar' in the middle of the field and 6 drummers from Ancestral Hands.

We are looking for volunteers to take part in the proceedings. As a volunteer, you will be visible and lit, but basically anonymous. You will be taught simple moves that will aim to get the crowd moving. We hope it will be a lot of fun and fairly brief - 15 to 20 minutes.

Volunteers are invited to an optional workshop on **Thursday the 12th of October** when the movement director plans out the movement. Then there is a rehearsal on **Thursday the 19th**. Both the **workshop and the rehearsal are in the evening, location TBC**. At **3pm on Sunday 29th** we'll do a dress rehearsal with the drummers. Once the gathering is over, the volunteers can go and enjoy their evening.

We have about 10 people but 20 or more would be ideal - then there's not so much pressure. We have 2 professional actors taking part too.

As it happens the second Tuesday of October coincides with your chairman's 65th birthday!


David is inviting STC members part, present and future to join him for an ad-hoc celebration. Just bring yourself, some drink and some snacks to Vinters Studio 2 from
