The play is sharply observed and very funny. It was a hit when shown at the Lyric Theatre, Hammersmith, last year.

The show will be performed at Goldfinch Primary School, 21 Cunliffe Street, SW16 6DS, from Thursday May 30th to Saturday June 1st.

The doors open 30 minutes before, and so we'd like people to arrive around 6.30 to 6.45 for the evening shows, and 2.30 to 2.45 for the matinee.

A Midsummer Night's Dream - Casting Call

Robin Bracken-Kemish, one of our members, is directing A Midsummer Night's Dream at The Cryer Arts Centre in Carshalton on the 16th and 17th August. (3 performances: Friday evening, Saturday matinee + evening). Robin has asked us to include this casting call.

You must be available for a dress rehearsal on the 15th, but otherwise rehearsals will be flexible and can work around your availability.

Rehearsals will start online at the end of May to beginning of June, then move to in

person in/near Carshalton for the rest of June and July.

This is an amateur production and no payment or travel compensation etc will be made to actors. However there will also be no membership or show fees involved in taking part! You may be asked to provide parts of your own costume if you are able to.
