

## Let's Open Streatham's Two Closed **Theatres**



There are currently two purpose-built theatres in Streatham, both currently closed. STC would like to see them both reopened!

The large, grand Streatham Hill Theatre, opened in 1929, is on the scale of the London Palladium. It became a bingo hall in 1962. STC performed its first show there in 2013, and continued to put on shows until the end of 2016, after which it closed. Since then there has been a campaign to get it reopened as an arts and cultural centre with performance space, events spaces and co-working. There is a commercial, funded theatre company interested in taking on the Theatre in that way. However, the Theatre was bought by Ruach City Church in 2022 and Ruach is now seeking planning permission to turn the Theatre into a church. STC would like the Theatre to be able to remain available for performances, events and rehearsals etc, both by STC and other local arts groups. Please see the Friends of Streatham Hill Theatre campaign for more, and how you can help by commenting on the planning application.

The smaller, studio theatre Streatham Space Project opened in 2018, built as part of the London Square development in Streatham Hill. It was intended to be available to groups like STC, but in practice was too expensive to hire by community groups, so STC didn't stage anything there. This theatre ultimately was unable to continue to operate and closed in March 2025. STC approached the operators to see if we could help by bringing events and customers, in return for cheaper use of the space, but were rejected. Another local campaign is forming to get this space back into use and actually available to groups like STC, as the first task of a newly created Streatham Arts Community - please check out their website and join the campaign!

Clown Around with Trained Clown, Sandra Villani, this Tuesday, May 13th



Continuing April's theme, we have a **Clowning Workshop**, led by professional clown and actor Sandra Villani. A fun night of theatre in the Italian tradition (no experience necessary).

This is what Sandra has to say about the workshop:

This is an introduction to the clown; with the use of games, movement, sound, silence, stillness and so much more.

The clown as an image conjures different things to different people. In this workshop we will explore your clown within. I came to clowning through the tutelage of a wonderful clown, Didier Dantois at his Sacred Art of Clowning school. Since then I have clowned around from time to time.

For this workshop no experience in clowning is necessary, just a willingness to be open to the moment.

It's probably a good idea to wear something comfy so that you can move around freely. Come and play and clown around with me!

Sandra has a BA in Theatre Studies and has training in Japanese Butoh dance and in clowning at the Sacred Art of Clowning school.

Directing experience includes: Songs for a New World (New Diorama) and many Gray's Inn shows; Creative Director on Jerusalem (Network Theatre); Assistant Creative Producer on The Tyrannicide Brief (Gray's).

Acting experience includes: Read Not Dead plays (Globe Theatre at Gray's); Sweeney Todd; Emperor of the Moon; Bye Bye Beethoven (in the UK, Germany and Venezuela). Sandra sings with Citizens of the World Choir (the Barbican and Channel 4). She also performs her own poetry on stage and on film.
