"I'm so looking forward to seeing Streatham Theatre Company's production of

Run For Your Wife", says Cooney. "Actually, the Japanese production is also

playing that week, but Streatham's easier to get to!"

The play is partly set in Streatham, yet has never been staged in the area. STC's

chairman and the play's director, David Harvey, says "This is a challenging show

to produce, but we love a challenge. Our aim is to make Ray Cooney laugh!"

"I'm delighted that Run For Your Wife is being performed in Streatham because I

spent so much of my childhood there", Cooney adds. "My Auntie Rosie, Auntie

Phyllis and Auntie Ivy all lived in Streatham and I saw them once a week. I lived

in Clapham with my mum and dad and we'd take the dog for a walk on Streatham

Common. I was never out of Streatham - I love it."
