Director's Notes

A great deal of work has gone into planning and creating this production. *Hamlet off the Street* began life as *Hamlet on the Street*, an idea hatched by David, our Chairman, based on the meaning of Streatham. Once we had discussed it in Committee however, it soon became obvious that organising a performance on a public street would be too problematical, and the project was shelved. Then, last July, Helen Mason and I toured St Leonard's during the Streatham Festival, and even before we had entered the main body of this beautiful building, we were convinced that we had found the ideal 'off the street' venue for Hamlet.

At the beginning of the year, I began an adaptation, which after some trial and error, we agreed was workable. David and I met Canon Anna and church representatives in June with our proposal, and were delighted to find firstly, they were as enthusiastic as we were, and secondly, the internal renovations would be completed in time!

Since then, things have moved fast. We have assembled an extremely talented cast, who have a real feel for Shakespeare's peerless dialogue, visionary technical, props, and costume specialists, and above all, a perfect stage set. Even the furniture works brilliantly. *Hamlet off the Street* is my first major outing as Director, and I'm tremendously grateful for all the support I have received, particularly from Ian and Terry, my able assistants.
