Back in the day, Streatham was too genteel to have a music hall; the nearest one was the Empress, Brixton. However, variety shows were staged at the Streatham Town Hall, opposite where Aldi now stands, and a number of music hall and variety artists either lived in Streatham or had connections here. Since I've discovered that some of these are ancestors of friends and people I've come to know, I've become fascinated with the short lives and precarious careers of the music hall stars, and how incredibly hard they worked. They often performed at 6 or 7 halls in the same night, surviving on booze and a wide range of unregulated stimulants, including heroin and morphine!

I really hope you enjoy this tribute to the music hall and join in whenever you can, because after all the stars of the show, as Leonard Sachs, the Chairman of the Good Old Days always reminded us, are 'chiefly, yourselves'.
